The spectacular spring flower-show in the church grounds is always a joy to behold and this year has been no exception! A number of people have enjoyed visiting the church and grounds for our Easter and St George's day services, taking advantage of the newly restored garden seat, which is the perfect spot on a sunny day. Thank you, Kim, for doing such an excellent job on the seat!!

The Coronation week-end saw a large number of people visit the church on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May to view the flower displays on offer and take time out to reflect. The church did look truly special and sincere thanks to all who contributed. We have now sung the National Anthem a couple of times at our services and singing God Save the King still seems rather strange.







The following day the church benefitted from 'The Big Help Out' and volunteers gave the morning to undertake a number of long overdue cleaning initiatives!! In particular the choir stalls were polished, windows cleaned and the chairs tidied up. Many thanks to those who came and thanks to the Coronation Hall and the Refill Station for providing a lovely lunch after.

We held the annual general meeting of the Parish Church Council in April and all officers were re-elected. We were pleased to note that we continue to hold all planned services, which are loyally supported. The challenge of maintaining our historic listed church remains a major challenge just to meet essential running costs and maintenance costs. We are very grateful for the way the community supports our fund-raising efforts and to individuals and organisations who so generously give.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> June there is an Open Garden event in Clifton villages, with a grand prize draw, and the organisers have decided that all the profits from that will go to St George's Church. We are very grateful to Adam and all who are contributing on the day for what will also be a great community event, we are sure.

Our annual Harvest Festival service will be held on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> October and please put that date in your diary and keep a look out for further details.

Change and the Church of England is often seen as problematical. However, this year has already seen significant movement towards being a more inclusive organisation. The statement recently from the Archbishop of Canterbury recognising the importance of all, be they in a relationship or remaining single by choice, is an indicator of that. This follows the General Synod acknowledging relationships between the

same sex, and that such couples may be blessed in church. While the church is so often valued for its stability it must also be seen as relevant to all. We are very fortunate to have Revd Mandy at our helm at these times and her voice of love of the scriptures and people shines through on her ministry.

As always, we look forward to seeing you at our services and events, and again sincere thanks to all for your support.

#### Trent Vale Trail Edging Closer to South Clifton

In 2017 a few people formed a community group with an idea to establish a trail for non-motorised traffic to connect the East Trent villages from Newark ending in South Clifton. At that stage they had no idea whether it was practical nor how they would fund it. The group has now morphed into Friends of Trent Vale Trail, a registered charity, managed entirely by volunteers. Two South Clifton residents are trustees of the charity, Bindy Dadswell and John Ford.

The trail is now completed to the edge of Spalford Parish and is only a mile from Coal Yard Lane. It currently passes through Winthorpe, Collingham, Besthorpe and Girton using a combination of quiet country lanes and rights of way where the Friends of Trent Vale Trail have improved the surfaces for use by walkers, cyclists and in some sections horse riders and wheel chair users.

The Friends of Trent Vale remain committed to complete the final section of the trail from Green Lane, Girton over Clifton Hill connecting to Coal Yard Lane. The cost of improving the trail surface and all other work has been entirely funded by grants generously provided by organisations like National Grid, Tarmac, Landfill Communities Fund and most recently the Shared Prosperity Fund (SPF) via Newark & Sherwood District Council (N&SDC).

Last year the surface in Green Lane, Girton was improved and the SPF via N&SDC funded concrete pads to protect the loose surface from farm vehicle movements at field entrances. Friends of Trent Vale Trail have secured additional SPF funding for 2023/24 which will be used for work on the final section. The Friends of the Trent Vale Trail are working hard to secure more funding and hope to open the trail to South Clifton residents within the next year.

Beyond completion of the trail the charity has a longer-term vision to make the route a 'green corridor' so users can enjoy safe and accessible travel to appreciate the natural habitat.


important local landmark and to contribute towards new signage at South Clifton Sports Pavilion.

#### Recipe - Lemon Meringue Pie

#### Ingredients

#### Pastry Case

200g plain flour

Pinch of salt

50g lard

50g margarine or butter

8 tsp water (approx.)

#### Filling

Grated rind and juice of 2/3 lemons

Water

2 level tbsp. cornflour

2 egg yolks

50g caster sugar

125g caster sugar

#### Meringue

2 eggs white

125g caster sugar

#### Method

#### Cooked pastry case 18-20cm

- Mix flour and salt together.
- Cut the fat into small knobs and add it. Rub the fat into the flour until mixture looks like breadcrumbs.
- Add water, a little at a time until the mixture sticks together and knead lightly for a few seconds to give it a firm smooth dough. Rest in the fridge for 15 minutes.
- · Sprinkle a little flour onto a board and roll out pastry.
- Line a 18-20cm flan dish with the pastry, trim the edges, place a round of greased proof paper inside the pastry and half fill with baking beans.
- Blind bake for 15 minutes at 200C/400F/Mark 6.
- Remove the greaseproof paper and cook for a further 5 minutes.

#### Filling

- Put the lemon juice into a measure and add sufficient water to make 275ml (1/2 pint).
- Bring most of the juice and water to the boil and blend the cornflour with the remainder.
- Pour boiling water on to cornflour, return mixture to the pan and bring to the boil stirring all the time.
- Remove pan from the heat, beat in 2 egg yolks and add butter or margarine, sugar and grated lemon rind.
- · Pour filling into flan case.

#### Meringue

- Whisk egg whites until very stiff. Adding half a teaspoon of sugar at a time whisk until stiff, add remaining sugar with a metal spoon.
- Pile meringue onto lemon filling.
- Bake in a heated oven (150C/300F/Mark 2) until meringue is crisp and golden.

#### RULES

- All items must have been grown, created or produced by the exhibitor and, in the craft section, made
  by the exhibitor during the last year. Flowers for the flower arrangements may be bought.
- Exhibits to be staged <u>between 10.00 11.30am</u>.
- Judging will take place <u>between 12.00 2.15pm</u>.
- Exhibits open for viewing, plus tea, coffee and biscuit from 2.30 4.00 pm.
- Entry fee 50p per entry, children's classes free.
- Exhibits may not be removed before 3.45 pm.
- Exhibits not collected or otherwise advised to the committee will be disposed of after the show.
- Four Trophies will be awarded for the highest number of points scored across the following classes:
  - Classes 1 to 16
  - Classes 17 to 21
  - Classes 22 to 34
  - Class 35
- A separate prize will be awarded in the children's classes.



#### Fulbeck Circular

Distance – approx. 5.5 miles (9 kms) (2.5 – 3 hours)
OS Explorer Map 272
An easy walk but with ascents and descents, using tracks, minor roads and field paths.



- 1. Leave the car park opposite the church and turn right along the main road. After a few metres turn right through a gap in a wall and follow the public footpath along the edge of the playing field. At the corner of the field go over a stile and continue in the same direction with the hedge now on your right.
- 2. At the end go through 2 gates, crossing a track which was once the Honington railway line, bear diagonally left across the field towards a telegraph pole and way marker post.
- 3. Bear right across the field to a way marker to the left of a large oak tree. Turn left and walk beside the old hedge to another way marker close to the corner of the substation fence. Turn right onto a bridleway (beside the fence) to a gate and road. Turn left onto North Heath Lane, walk until you reach A607, cross the disused railway line again.
- 4. Cross the main road with extreme care and go through the gate opposite. Bear diagonally left towards the houses, reaching gate and road. Turn right, after 100m walk down the road to the bottom of the hill.
- 5. Bear left and then 2<sup>nd</sup> right to follow a tarmac lane also a public bridleway, continue straight ahead, this lane turns into a farm track for approx.1 mile (1.75 km). When the track bears right towards a farm, continue straight ahead keeping the hedge to your left.
- 6. At a sign where the bridleway crosses a footpath turn sharp left and go diagonally across a field, continue in the same direction across the next field, heading for a church spire.
- 7. Cross over the minor road and onto a bridleway with a hedge to your left. After 300m turn right across the field to the corner of the wood. Turn left and walk alongside the woodland and up the hill. Turn right at the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> wood and around the field edge. 8. At the top of the ridge, turn left along a grass track towards Fulbeck and follow along this track for about 0.66 miles (1 km) passing a radio mast and a farm on your left.



9. Just before a main road, turn left along the field edge. Turn right over a footbridge, then diagonally left across the field towards a house. Go down the narrow path between the houses and down a tarmac lane. 10. Go straight ahead at the crossroads into the village. Continue straight at Scots Hill, then right at Hare & Hounds pub. Walk back to main road and car park.

## North Clifton Parish Meeting

#### Litter picking.

On 26<sup>th</sup> March eight parishioners ventured out on a cold morning to carry out a spring litter pick. In a couple of hours, they collected 3 bags of rubbish, a number of plastic drums and a car bumper! Additional volunteers returned later to carry out further work on Mill Lane and the A1133. It was noticeable that compared to many places North Clifton appears to be fairly clean so we hope our fellow parishioners respect their environment and keep it that way.

#### New foot path



Thanks to a small band of volunteers, Peter Brumpton, Peter Watson, and Chris Wilkes, the village has reinstated the path through the old allotment site, (shown green on the plan), cleared a strip up the A1133 grass verge, (shown blue) and cleared a path through the Croft family's wooded area (shown yellow) to link back up to the public path along the side of the field, (shown red). The section shown in yellow is not a public path but the Croft family have granted permissive rights for people to walk through the wood. This makes a pleasant circular walk from the village. It does need using, at the time of writing the grass is growing strongly and the path is becoming overgrown again but it is hoped that with a bit of use the path will become established and passable by all.

#### Jubilee Oak tree

The District Council have donated an oak tree to this, and other villages, to mark last years' Queens jubilee. Two trees were delivered but as they were little more than whips and we were sceptical about planting them. Martyn Pate however stepped in and very kindly swapped the two whips for two, four-foot-high oak specimens, one of which he planted on Mill Lane near the North Clifton sign and the other was given to the school which I believe has been planted in the garden that runs parallel to the road. I doubt if many reading this will see the trees reach maturity but. Hopefully. they will be a lasting legacy for future generations. A plaque marking the event will be installed on Mill Lane shortly.

#### Parish AGM

The Parish meeting AGM is once again looming on the horizon. It is being held in the Coronation Hall at 7.30pm on 22<sup>nd</sup> June. All parishioners are welcome and there is an opportunity to ask questions if anyone wants to. This is the meeting where people are elected to take on the various roles within the Parish, Chair of the parish meeting, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Planning liaison, Safer neighbourhoods rep, Parishes together rep and Minutes sec. If anyone wishes to take on any of the roles now is the time to come forward. Not all of the present incumbent wish to stay on and new blood is always welcome. 
We have planned for and planted vegetables in our secret garden, which we are looking forward to harvest later this term.

We have joined a new initiative - Farmer Time, where we have paired up with a farmer from Sussex and share information on FaceTime about his farm and our secret garden.




We still have lots to look forward to with an author visit, football competition and our summer production 'Troy Story'.
